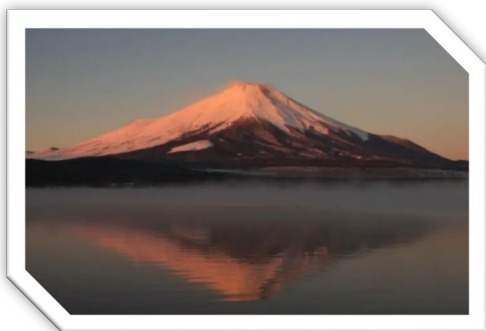

※Brief Introduction to the Tourist Spots

Lake Yamanaka (Free)



Lake Yamanaka is famous for its "Sakasafuji" (Upside-Down Fuji) landscape, where Mount Fuji is perfectly reflected in the lake's waters. From late November to late February each year, the northern shore of Lake Yamanaka also offers the chance to witness the breathtaking spectacle of "Diamond Fuji". On rare occasions with optimal weather conditions, visitors may even catch a glimpse of the "Double Diamond Fuji"—a stunning scene where the Diamond Fuji is mirrored in the lake below.

Oshino hakkai (Free)

Oshino Hakkai is located in Oshino Village between Yamanaka Lake and Kawaguchi Lake in Yamanashi Prefecture. It is a group of springs that originated from the melting snow of Mount Fuji more than 1,200 years ago. It is dotted with eight small ponds with clear springs, namely Yufu Pond, Bottomless Pond, Choshi Pond, Zhuo Pond, Yong Pond, Mirror Pond, Acorus Pond, and Exit Pond. In 2013, it was listed in the world as a constituent asset of Mount Fuji. cultural heritage.



Oishi Park (Free)

Dashi Park is located in the Dashi area on the north bank of Kawaguchi Lake. It is a park facing the shore of Kawaguchi Lake. Like Yagizaki Park on the south bank, it is famous for lavender, and it is also the second venue of the Kawaguchiko Lavender Festival. In the park, there are Kawaguchiko



Natural Life Museum, a coffee shop with a view of Mount Fuji, and a large stone glaze traditional handicraft museum. You can also visit these venues while enjoying the natural beauty.
